


Johann's Gift to Christmas: Jack Richards by Jilly Day



R eaders of the Chalet School will be familiar with the origins of *Silent Night, Stille Nacht.* When, just before Christmas 1818, the church organ in the small Tyrolean village of Oberndorf was found to be damaged, organist and school teacher Franz Xavier Gruber, composed a simple tune for words written by the priest Joseph Mohr. But Johann, also had a role in the composition of *Silent Night.* So, who was Johann and why does his name remain unknown?
